We are a membership-based registered charity pushing for positive change, on behalf of everyone who rides a bike in our region – and everyone who would love to give it a go - making safer, more liveable streets, and making it easier to be good kaitiaki (guardians / stewards) for Papatūānuku (Earth).

The Purpose of this role

To activate and support community-led projects which encourage an active paihikara (bike) culture for whānau and their local community.

- Work with Bike Burbs on marketing and social media initiatives
- Guide Bike Burbs to identify funding and support for Bike Burb goals
- Support Bike Burbs to develop their own events or to add to other local events
- Encourage Bike Burbs to activate safe local bike paths
- Develop and update resources for Bike Burbs
- Keep records of the programme by tracking Bike Burb growth and change
- Build and maintain relationships with key groups such as Auckland Transport, Auckland Council, Panuku, Waka Kotahi, Local Boards
- Work with the Crew to deliver campaigns and events such as Biketober

- Passionate about diversity and inclusion. A desire to reduce barriers to inclusion for disabled people, our rainbow community, and ethnic communities
